AMERICAN ARCHITECTS SELECT 114 BUILDINGS IN THIRTY-EIGHT NATIONS TO WIN THE WORLD'S MOST PRESTIGIOUS 2008 INTERNATIONAL ARCHITECTURE AWARDS

SEPTEMBER 1, 2008, Chicago, Illinois. . . The Chicago Athenaeum: Museum of Architecture and Design and Metropolitan Arts Press Ltd. and co-presented by The European Centre for Architecture Art Design and Urban Studies, announce one hundred and fourteen (114) new distinguished projects and urban schemes selected in this year's prestigious **International Architecture Awards**® program for 2008.

Given the record numbers of entries this year and the widest geographic distribution of buildings worldwide, **The International Architecture Awards** have become a global event of an unprecedented scale—the most important barometer for the future direction of new architectural design and thinking today—celebrating, recognizing, and highlighting the world's foremost architectural solutions for the designs of new skyscrapers, corporate buildings, institutions, arts facilities, airports, private homes, industrial structures, and urban planning projects from Paris to Hong Kong.

The International Architecture Awards is the only global Awards Program in architecture of its kind, which was conceived and presented by the Museum and in partnership with The European Center for Architecture Art Design and Urban Studies to give an important overview of design and architecture on a world scale.

The Awards Program draws important public and professional focus for the celebration and recognition of the most important key buildings produced in this decade, underscoring the highest level of imagination and inspiration of the "best of the best" architectural minds practicing design today. The selected projects challenge new approaches to design that are beyond the envelope of the everyday, while providing cities with key civic building that celebrate and harmonize architecture as a high art while finding answers to the complicated problems of environment, social context, improving quality of life, and sustainability.

And the list of this year's winning schemes is impressive drawn by some of the world's most talented thinkers from large and small architectural practices around the world. The glossary of entries is a "Who's Who" in international architecture practice today.

For the 2008 **International Architecture Awards**, the Museum received hundreds of submissions from design firms in Europe, Asia, Africa, Australia, and the Americas. The submissions ranged from the latest new corporate high-tech headquarters to smaller planning projects, bridges, memorials, sacred spaces, and private residences. All submitted projects were designed by architects in their respective countries of origin or abroad for both built and unbuilt projects alike, as of January 1, 2004.

This year's jury for awards took place in New York with the assistance of the New York Chapter of The American Institute of Architects and included some of the most influential design minds of our time:

The International Architecture Awards are curated and organized by Christian K. Narkiewicz-Laine, President, The Chicago Athenaeum and assisted by Lary L. Sommers, Director of Administration/Marketing and Ioannis Karalias, Museum Vice President, The Chicago Athenaeum, and Kieran Conlon, Director/COO from the European Centre for Architecture, Art, Design, and Urban Studies.

The geographic range in this year's Awards Program attests to the global significance of this program organized by The Chicago Athenaeum and The European Centre.

Out of the one hundred and fourteen (114) projects selected for awards, Great Britain received the highest number of fourteen (14) awards followed by China and The United States with ten (10) and with Germany having eight (8) awards. The Netherlands was awarded with six (6) distinguished awards. Both Canada, Japan, and Mexico won five (5) awards and Austria, France, Portugal with four (4) awards each. Three (3) awards were given to projects in Poland, Spain, and the United Arab Emirates. Korea, Singapore, Italy had

two (2) awarded projects each. Single awards were given to Costa Rica, Denmark, Belgium, Vietnam, Lebanon, Luxembourg, Brazil, Russia, Egypt, Kuwait, Australia, Iceland, Columbia, Latvia, Finland, Qatar, Thailand, Ireland, and Burkino Faso.

“The International Architecture Awards Program, as organized by The Chicago Athenaeum and The European Center,” states jury member, Henry Smith-Miller, “is a premier venue for innovative and excellent design; works by world class architects share the same platform with the relatively unknown, resulting in a comprehensive and global review of contemporary architecture theory and practice.”

The French firm of Christian de Portzamparc won three (3) awards for new buildings in Brazil, Luxembourg, and The Netherlands and the British firm of Foster + Partners won four (4) awards for projects in Germany, France, and the United States while the New York, Chicago, London, and San Francisco offices of Skidmore, Owings & Merrill won a total of nine (9) awards for towers, planning projects, and masterplans in Egypt, China, Austria, Kuwait, The Netherlands, United Arab Emirates, and the USA.

One of the boldest and largest projects awarded in 2008 is Christian de Portzamparc's Cidade da Musica in Rio de Janeiro—an absolute masterpiece of poetry and materials and an overwhelming scale that will bring an instant landmark to this Brazilian city. Equally poetic is the Foster + Partners' Millau Viaduct—a mesmerizing marriage of advanced engineering and striking architectural design. Staggering and expressive are the words for the CCTV Television Headquarters in Beijing by Rem Koolhaas and the Office for Metropolitan Architecture. Koolhaas' design will be, for certain, one of this Century's most notable hallmarks in the history of art and architecture.

“Good design is all around us,” comments jury member, Joseph E. MacIsaac, President, Knoll International. “And fortunately for us,” he continues, “with the quality of the architectural projects represented in the 2008 International Architects Awards, good design will continue to enrich the places we live, work, eat, sleep, worship and play. “

Some of the most dazzling achievements are commissions built for public and civic architecture. The Civil Justice Centre in Manchester by Denton Corker Marshall is a beautifully executed response to a complex program that makes a striking contribution to the regeneration of this British city. Likewise the Antwerp Law Courts by Rogers Stirk Harbour + Partners with its stunning sail-like timber roof. Henning Larson's monumental Icelandic National Concert and Conference Center is bold and geometric as it stands in more calm Reykjavik, but nonetheless takes its influence from the dramatic Icelandic landscape and the ever changing colors—from a indigo blue to a fiery red. David Chipperfield's Museum of Modern Literature, a building in Marbach am

Necker, Germany, combines modernism and classicism with reductive clarity, embodied in materials that give architectural language a calm, sensual yet highly physical presence.

"The Chicago Athenaeum: Museum of Architecture and Design together with The European Center for Architecture Art Design and Urban Studies have organized this annual program, **The International Architecture Awards**, as a way in which to draw significant world attention to new buildings and urban planning projects being built and designed globally by the best and most prestigious international architecture offices and design firms," states Christian K. Narkiewicz-Laine.

"The wide geographic distribution of these awards attests to the importance of the program," Mr. Narkiewicz-Laine adds. "There is no one, single architecture program in existence today that brings together the latest cutting-edge international architecture today as one cohesive universal representation or platform for world design. The Museum is honored to provide a focus that allows an exploration and analysis for current stylistic directions and philosophical thinking that is apparent in contemporary design today."

"The wide range of project awards in the International Competition," adds Rick Bell, Executive Director, The New York Chapter / AIA, "testify to a worldwide burgeoning of design talent and availability of the resources for bringing design excellence to fruition. We at the Center for Architecture in New York were pleased to host the international jury and to see its remarkably affable and inclusive process."

The awarded projects for 2008 form an exhibition, "**New World Architecture**" to open as an exhibition sponsored by the Municipality of Florence and the School of Architecture in Florence at the SESV Santa Verdiana this November. After Florence, the exhibition tours to The European Centre's new Contemporary Space Athens in Greece.
